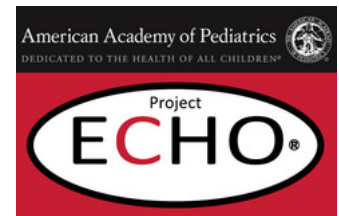
Project ECHO is a **learning collaborative** that brings together learners and subject matter experts using short **presentations** and **peer-to-peer** learning.
