



Tobacco-Use Prevention Education (TUPE)







The goal of tobacco use prevention education (TUPE) is to

...prevent or reduce student tobacco use and nicotine addiction through tobacco-specific, evidence-informed educational instruction and activities that build knowledge, social skills, and youth development assets.



This goal is accomplished through the following strategies...

- Classroom-based prevention programs
- Youth Development Peer Education
- Intervention & Cessation
- Staff Professional Development
- Family & Community Engagement




Peer Educators



TUPE peer educators are young people who are trained to provide tobacco prevention information, resources, and support to their peers, as well as inspire all members of the school community by modeling healthy choices and leadership.

Approach

 Young people are part of the solution, not the problem.

 We work in partnership with young people.



Young people's initiatives and leadership

Adults' initiative, joint decisions

Adults make decisions, young people are consulted and informed

Young people are assigned tasks and informed how and why they are involved in a project

Participation for show - young people have little or no influence on their activities

Decoration - young people help implement adults' initiatives

Manipulation - adults use young people to support their own projects and pretend they are the result of young people's inspiration

Role of Adult Allies & Students

Adult Allies guide and support students to conduct effective in-person or virtual classroom presentations, on the health risks associated with the usage of tobacco/nicotine, and cannabis products, with a focus on healthy alternatives.

Student Peer Educators/Advocates deliver anti-tobacco messages at their school, primarily through classroom presentations and school-wide events, teach new information about tobacco, encourage non-tobacco users to stay tobacco free and encourage current tobacco users to cut back or quit, and have fun.

TIPS FOR ADULTS

- Be authentic, they can sense fakeness.
- ❖ Partner with young people they are the solution, not the problem.
- Engage young people, be patient and open to listen.
- ❖Look for who young people are listening to some of your best young leaders may not be in a leadership class.
- Find out what impact they want to make.
- ❖ Keep the conversation going.
- ❖Set a positive example.
- Provide incentives, aka "benefits of belonging"
- **❖**Have FUN!

Peer Educator Trainings



The goals of the training are to:

- Equip students with information about tobacco, including e-cigarettes.
- Demonstrate activities that can be used and adapted to educate their peers.
- Model that learning about tobacco can be fun.

- Planning time



Retention

- Respect their efforts and their time.
- Meet consistently.
- Listen to their ideas and allow them to make decisions.
- Transfer leadership.
- INCENTIVES INCENTIVES!
- Share Peer Educators' names with teachers and other adults on campus and encourage adults to acknowledge them for their work.
- Provide adequate training and ongoing support.
- If possible, off-campus opportunities major hit!
- Celebrate accomplishments.
